whereon I now live with all my stocks of all kinds and household  
furniture to continue her during life or widowhood and no longer  
and after her Marriage or Death to be Equally Divided between  
my beloved Children Benjamin Pendleton, James Pendleton, Edmund  
Pendleton, Richard Pendleton, Mary Pendleton, John Pendleton, Robert  
Pendleton, William Pendleton, Sarah Pendleton, Franka Pendleton -  
and Pendleton Letta Pendleton, to them and their Heirs forever  
Item what I have given Benjamin Pendleton before this Day to  
go in his part which is a Cow and Calf three Pounds Ten shillings  
a bolt four shillings and ten shillings worth of Butter, also  
and Pendleton has had a Horse at Seven pounds to go in his  
part also Edmund Pendleton has had a Horse at four Pounds  
Ten shillings to go in his part Item I give to James Pendleton  
fifty acres of Land whereon he now lives Joining my upper  
line to him and his heirs forever the said fifty Acres of Land to be  
valued immediately after my Death without the Improvements  
and such valuation to go in his part of the Estate when Divided  
also I Request that my Wife may give those of my Children that  
has had nothing as they shall come of Age above and Calf and  
a Cow and Piggs if she can Spare them Likewise I do give unto  
Richard Vinal of Culpeper County one Tract of Land whereon  
I formerly laid on the Waters of Smiths Run to him the Vinal  
and his heirs forever Lastly I do appoint my Beloved Wife -  
Elizabeth Pendleton my Executrix and my Beloved Sons James  
Pendleton and Edmund Pendleton my whole and sole Executors of this  
my last Will and Testament hereby Rescinding and Disannulling all  
other Testaments and Wills by me made Confirming this and no  
other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and Seal this Second Day of January one

 on the Penalty of four Thousand Pounds & with the Condition,  
 Required by law.

 make or cause to be made above and perfect Procuracy of all  
 and singular the Goods, Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased  
 which have or shall come to the hands, possession, or knowledge  
 of the said Elizabeth and James Pendleton, or into the hands and
