September 1779, George Penn Guardian to Frank Lee,
this Day presented this Account in Court, which he made
Oath to, and ordered to be Recorded,

In the Name of God Amen I William Hansbrough
of the County of Amherst being in a low State of health, but of
Sound Disposing memory do make this my Last Will and
Testament in manner and form following. First I commend my
Soul into the hands of Almighty God believing Remission
of Sin and Everlasting life by the Merits Death & Passion
of Jesus Christ my Lord and Saviour, and my Body to be buried
at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter Named, and as to
what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bestow on me, I
dispose thereof as follows, I give to my Son Caleb
Hansbrough and my Daughter Elizabeth Ball one shilling
Sterling Each, I then I give to my Daughter Rachael Hey
one Young Cow, one Doe and one Doe Lamb, I then I give

and Desire to my Son William Hanstrough one hundred Acres of Land part of the Tract whereon I now live, to be laid off in the following manner, Beginning at a Corner Pin in William Cabells line Next Julian Neale, thence with the Patent Line towards James Neale so far as to be twice as long as the width thence a straight line into the Land half the length of the first, thence a parallel line with the first to Cabells line & with his line to the Beginning, to my said Son and his heirs forever. Item I give to my Daughters Sarah and Charlotte Ten Pounds each to be paid them on their Marriage or Shortly afterwards, Item my Tract of Land on Cabells Mill Creek containing one hundred and fifty Six Acres, and my Tract in the Glades of one hundred and Twelve Acres (for which last mentioned Tract no Patent is yet obtained) I give and Desire to my Executors or the Survivors of them, in Trust that they or any two of them shall sell and convey the same for the Best Price that can be got, and the money arising from the Sale thereof to be put out to Interest untill my Son John arrives to the Age of Twenty one years, and that he then be paid one fourth part of the whole Sum, the other three fourths to be paid to my Sons James, Samuel and Peter as they Each Respectively arrive to the Age of Twenty one years, and in case either of my said Sons, John, James, Samuel & Peter Should Depart this Life before they arrive to the Age of Twenty one Years as aforesaid, then my Will is that their part should be Equally Divided between the Survivors of them, Item I lend to my Beloved Wife Fizziah Hanstrough the Uses of the Remainder of the Tract of Land I live on containing Two hundred and Thirty Acres together with all my Personal Estate for and During her Natural Life to Enable her to Raise and Educate my Small Children, Item my Will and Desire is that after my Wifes Decease the Land and Personal Estate Lent her be Sold by my Executors or the Survivors of them and the money arising from the Sale of the Land to be Equally Divided between my Sons, John, James, Samuel and Peter or the Survivors of them as they Respectively arrive to the Age of Twenty one Years, should my Wife die -
