these Presents, sealed with our Seals this fifth Day of April
in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Sixty two
and in the Second year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George
the third.

The Condition of this obligation is such, that if the above
bound Mary Sudarth Executrix of the Last Will and Testament
of William Sudarth Deceased do make or cause to be made
a true and Perfect Inventory of all and Singular, the Goods, Chattels
and Credits of the said Deceased, which have or shall come to
the hands Possession or knowledge of the said Mary Sudarth
or into the hands and Possession of any other Person or Persons for
her and the same or made, do Exhibit into the County Court of
