Equal Share with the Mother and other four Children before
mentioned, and if any of my Children should die in their Non age
I allow his share of the Personal Estate to be Equally Divided
amongst the Surviving Children. Item I Do give & Bequeath
a Treasury Warrant for four hundred and Twenty five Acres of
Land Supposed to be laid upon the Waters of the Kentucky
to my three Sons Nathan, Andrew and Alexander to be Equally
Divided betwixt them according to Quantity and Quality, Severally
Share and Share alike to them and their heirs forever; and if the
Child my Wife is now big with be a Boy I allow it to have an
Equal share with the other three Boys as before mentioned, & Should
any of the Sons Die before they Arrive to Lawfull Age or
without Issue it is my Will that his Share be Divided amongst the
Survivors Equally as a before mentined, and should there be Issue
to Descend to them, and Lastly I do appoint my Loving Wife Martha
Executrix and Alexander Reid Jun^r, and William Barnett Executors
of this my Last Will and Testament, and I do hereby Revoke and
Disannul all former Wills and Testaments, Ratifying ^{Confirming} this only
