In the Name of God Amen the Twelfth Day of April in the Year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and Eighty one James Woods of the Parish and County of Amherst Planter being very sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be Given to God for it therefore calling to Mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that Gave it and for my Body I command to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and Decent manner at the Discretion of my Executor Nothing Doubtless but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and as touching all such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life I give Bequeath and Dispose of in the following manner and form Imprimis I give and Bequeath to my beloved Wife Barbara Woods all my Estate both Real and Personal During her Natural Life Item it is my Will that at my Wifes Death that my Grandson James Woods have all the Land that I am possessed of which is the place where I now live on also One hundred and fifty Acres Adjoining, also Two hundred Acres Gaining Lying higher up the River, also Two hundred & five Acres Gaining the last mentioned Tract lying above one the same

River, also One hundred Acres bearing where Samuel Woods Dicased
 Last Lived, also four hundred Acres lying in Albemarle County,
 Joining to Hugh Alexander Mill Tract, also Six Negroes Namely,
 Ben, Cate, and her Children, James, Adam, Cate, and Mollie,
 and her and their ~~Effects~~ with all my Household Goods & Worthing
 Belanels, also one Pied Cow, and one Pied Yearling Heifer, also
 Two Plow Horses, also and Equal part with the Rest of my
 Grand Children in all the other part of my Estate both Rail
 and Personal To him his Heirs and Assigns and that forever
 I have given and Bequeath to my Grand Children, William, Mary,
 Margaret, Barbara, Elizabeth, and Jane Woods Six Negroes,
 Namely, old Ben, Noll, Fan, Denah, Anueha, and Tie, and what
 Money is found after my Decease, or Deaths, all my Stock of Horses
 Cows and Hogs, only an Equal part Excepted for my Grandson
 James Woods, besides what is Separately mentioned to him above
 and if my Grandson James Woods, Should Die before he Marrie
 or Comes of Age his part of my Estate shall be Equally Divided
 among my five Grand daughters or the surviving part of them and
 if any of the other ~~Five~~ Legatees Should Die before the Come of Age
 or Marrie their part shall be Equally Divided among the whols of the
 surviving party, also the whole of my Estates to Lie in my Grandson
 James Woods hands till the other Legatees Marrie or Come of Age and
 their part to be paid to them Annually as the Marrie or Come of Age
 I have Likewise Constituted made and Ordain my beloved friends
 William Simpson Sen^r. and my Grandson James Woods to be my
 Whole and Sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament and
 I do hereby Utterly Disallow Procke and Disannull all and every
 other former Wills and Legacies Requests and Executors by me in
 any wise before this time Named Willed and Bequeathed, Ratifying
 and Confirming this and no other to be my Last Will and Testament

Matthew Harris, ^{Wm. H.} David Shelton, John Pope, and Joseph Roberts
his Securitys Interests into and Acknowledged their Bond in the
Summity of Two Thousand Pounds Specie, with the Condition
Required by Law, and the said Will was ordered to be Recorded,

Harris, and Joseph Roberts, are held and firmly Bound unto James
Neal, Hugh Rose, James Dillard and Benjamin Rucker Gent.
Justices of the Court of Amherst County now sitting on the sum
of Two Thousand Pounds Specie, To the Payment whereof well
and truly to be made to the said Justices and their Successors we
bind ourselves, and each of us, our, and each of our heirs, Executors

presents, Sealed with our Seals, this fourth Day of June In the
Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Eighty one
and in the fifth Year of the Commonwealth

The CONDITION of the above Obligation is such that If the
above Bound James Woods Executor of the Last Will and Testament
of James Woods Deceased, do make or cause to be made a true &
perfect Inventory of all and Singular the Goods Chattels and Credits
of the said Deceased, which have, or shall come to the hands
Profession or knowledge of the said James Woods, or into the
hands and Profession of any other Person or Persons for him, and
the same is made do exhibit into the County Court of Amherst at
such time as he shall be thereunto Required by the said Court, and
the same Goods Chattels and Credits, and all other the Goods, Chattels,
