Nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same by the mighty Power of God again and as Touching my Worldly Estate I give and Bequeathe in the following manner, I Give to my Seven first Sons Born of my Wife Lucy Ten shillings Starting to be Equally Divided amongst them by my Executors being all the Estate Left to them by me, I Give Also to my well beloved Wife Lucy and my Daughter Lucy a Reasonable Maintenance out of my Estate to be given and provided by my Son William Witt, and if in Case he Deceases before them the Estate is to be Taken into the hands of my Executors to to Maintain them with During their Lives, and then my Son William Witt if a live to be possessed with all the Lands and personal Estate Goods & Chatties I dye possessed with, and if in Case my Son William Witt Deceases without heir his Estate to be Sold and Equally Divided between Littleberry & George & Pisha Witt my three Sons, and all other Wills heretofore made I do hereby Revoke

and do constitute this my Last Will and Testament In Witness
