The Condition of this Obligation is Such that if the above Bound Francis Wood Executor of the Last Will and Testament of John Wood Deceased do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and Singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Francis Wood, or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him, and the same so made do Exhibit into the County-Court of Amherst, at such time as he shall be therunto Required by the Court, and ^{and all other the Goods, Chattels and Credits} the same Goods Chattels and Credits, of the said Deceased, which at any time after shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Francis Wood, or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him do well and truly Administer According to Law, and farther do make a just and true Account of his Actings and Doings therein when thereto Required by the said Court, and also shall well and truly pay and Deliver all the Legacies Contained and Specified in the said Testament as far as the said Goods Chattels and Credits Will therunto Extend, and the Law shall Charge, Then this Obligation to be Void, and of none Effect, or Else to Remain in full force & Virtue
