 Goodrich Executors to my Estate her unto I put my Hand and Seal  
 this thirtieth day of January one thousand Seven hundred Eighty four

 and acknowledged their Bond in the Penalty of three hundred pounds

I know all men by these presents that we William Mar and John Duncan and  
and firmly bound to William Cabell James Dillard Ambrose Rucker Adams  
Diggs and Benjamin Rucker first Justices of the Court of Amherst County now  
sitting in the sum of three hundred pounds to the payment whereof well &  
to be made to the said Justices and their Successors we bind our selves and each  
of us our and each of our Heirs Executors and Administrators Jointly and severally  
firmly by these presents sealed with our seals this seventh day of June in the  
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Eighty Four in the eighth  
year of the Commonwealth

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound  
William Mar Exec. of the last will and testament of Martha Hudson die  
do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular  
the goods Chattels & Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come  
to the hands Possession or knowledge of the said Exec. or into the hands  
and Possession of any other Person or Persons for him and the same so make a  
Exhibit into the County Court of Amherst at such time as he shall be there required  
by the said Court and the same goods Chattels & Credits and all other the good  
Chattels & Credits of the said deceased which at any time after shall come to the hands  
Possession or knowledge of the said Exec. or into the hands and Possession of any  
other person or persons for him do well and truly administer according to  
Law and further do make a just and true account of his actions and doings.  
Then when thereto required by the said Court I also shall well and truly  
Pay and deliver all the Legacies contained & specified in the said testa-  
ment as far as the said goods Chattels & Credits will thereunto extend  
and the law shall charges then this obligation to be Void and of no  
Effect or else to remain in full force and Virtue
