In the Name of God Amen I John Emmons of the County and Parish of Amherst, being Sick and low in Body, but of perfect mind & memory thanks be to Almighty God calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and that it is Appointed for all Men once to Die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say
Principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be Buried in a Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive the same by the Mighty Power of God, As touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless me in this Life, I give Devise and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form First, that my Executors Should Settle and pay of all my Just Debts, And after that is Done, I Send to my Wife Mary Emmons all my Estat both personall and Reall as Long as She Lives my Widow, but in Case She Should Marry, one third part of the same, she is to have and no more and the Remainder It is my Desire to be Taking Care of till my Brother Samuel Emmons Son John Emmons Should
