

I, James H. Anderson do make this my last will and testament as follows
First. I give and bequeath to Wm A. Ballou and hereby relinquish to him
what ever amount he may owe me at my death

Second. I give and bequeath to Mr Mary E. Roberts all my house-hold furniture
beds, bedding and other articles, trinkets &c, in the room occupied by me at
the home of Henry C. Hunt,

Third. I desire my Executors herein after named to sell all the balance of my
estate both real and personal. Either privately or publicly, and
on such terms as they may think best; and after paying all my
just debts, it is my desire that the balance of the proceeds of my
estate be divided into three equal parts, and that one third be paid
to Mr Mary E. Roberts, and that one third be used by my Executors in
the manner deemed best by them for the support and maintenance
of the children of John C. Anderson. And that the remaining and
last third be used by my Executors in the manner deemed wisest
by them for the support and maintenance of the children of
Mr Alice Patterson of Buckingham County.

I nominate and appoint John C. Anderson and Jas. P. Ford Executors
of this my last will and testament. Either of whom may qualify
and act in that capacity. I further request that no security
be required of either of my Executors, and that no account
be required of them.
