

I James Pendleton of the County of Amherst being of sound and disposing mind, do make constitute and ordain this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all or any other Will or Wills by me heretofore made, declaring this only to be my last Will and Testament, to wit. I will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid.

Secondly Whereas Judith Churchwell (alias Jueth Evans) has lived with me for some time past in the capacity of Housekeeper & manager of my domestic concerns, in consequence of which, I will her one negro Woman Slave by name of Sophia, also her child Solomon together with the future increase of the woman Sophia, to her & her heirs forever. I also will to her one feather Bed, and furniture in addition to the one she now has in possession, also one Spool Wren Colt two years old this Spring. Also one large steel skin Stunk to her & her heirs forever. I also will her two Acres of Corn to be delivered her on leaving my house after my death. I also will her thirty Acres of land to be taken off the tract whereon I now live on the East end, on the back where it joins the land of Elisha Walker Sec^d so as to include a string in the boundary, so long as she may think proper to live on it and no longer. Thirdly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Robert Garland and James Pomeroy or either of them, that they may prefer at the time to carry this part of my Will into execution wherein the said Judith Churchwell is interested. Fourthly, I will the balance of my Estate both real and personal of every kind to my Daughter (Betsey McDaniel) and her children at her death, share and share alike. Fifthly, It is my will and desire that my son in Law William McDaniel shall act as Trustee of the Estate left my Daughter and her children for their benefit. Sixthly, and lastly I do hereby appoint William McDaniel Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 9th day of May in the year of our Lord 1828.
