At a circuit court of Amherst County, continued by adjournment and held on the 23 day of March 1857

The last will and testament of John S. Camden deceased was produced into court and proved by the oaths of Nathaniel A. Mantely and Henry Soring two subscribing witnesses, and ordered to be recorded - And on the motion of Susan A. Camden the Executrix therein named, who made oath thereof, entered into and acknowledged a bond (without security now being required by the will) in the penalty of \$3000 - Conditions according to law, Certificate is granted her for obtaining a probat of the said will in due form
