being weak in body but of sound and disposing mind and memory blessed be
Almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last will and
Testament in manner and form following (to wit) First (after all my just
debt being paid) I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Frances
Alcock

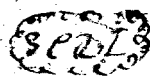
(or my order) all my Land and Property of every kind and description during her natural life excepting sixty acres to be taken of the above said Land adjoining Kennedy and Higginbotham's Lands that I give and bequeath unto my two youngest Daughters Elizabeth H. Allcock and Nancy Tiller to them and their heirs forever to be equally divided between them at any time when they shall see cause to have it done and all the profits arising from said Land from this date and if either of them die without heir her part shall return to the other and after the decease of my beloved wife Francis Allcock (or my widow) I give and bequeath unto my son John Allcock all my Land excepting the above mentioned sixty Acres to him and his heirs forever -

I further Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth H. Allcock one negro woman named Polly after after mine and my beloved wife Francis Allcock (or my widow) decease and all the increase of said negro after our deaths as above should then be any I further give her one cow and calf of her kind one feather bed and furniture on bedshead one woman's saddle two chests one trunk one Large walnut Table and all the earthen Jewels iron and wooden vessels that may remain at our deaths to her and her heirs forever I also give and bequeath unto my son John Allcock after our deaths as above, one negro girl named Mildred Wash to him and her heirs forever - I also give and bequeath unto my Daughter Nancy Tiller one negro girl named Sarah Ann and one small walnut Table to her and her heirs forever and should there be any more increase from Polly the Negro woman above mentioned during mine and my beloved wife Francis Allcock (or my widow) months

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named Sarah Ann and one small walnut table to her and her heirs forever. And
Should there be any more increase from Polley the Negro woman above men-
tioned during mine and my beloved wife Frances Allcock's or my undown medi-
cal life that increase with all the rest residue and remainder of my pro-
perty of what kind and nature soever I give and bequeath to my six children
to be equally divided between them after our deaths as above and I do hereby
appoint my beloved wife Frances Allcock for my widow, executrix and my three
sons executors of this my last will and testament - hereby revoking all former
wills by me made in West Virginia of which I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this sixteenth day of April Eighteen hundred and ten.

At a Superior Court of Law held for Amherst County the 26th day
of April 1820
The last will and testament of Richard Allcock deceased was proved by the oaths of
Micajah Penickton & George Penn witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded & on the
motion of John Allcock one of the Executors therein named who made oath thereto and
together with Micajah Penickton & W^m Forsley his securities entered into and ac-
knowledged

a bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars executed in the Law Courts
 certificate is granted him for obtaining probate in due form liberty being reserved
 for the other executors named will named to join in the probate when they
 shall think fit.

A list of probate fees sent to the Clerk of
 the General Court from 18th Apr 1815 to 18th

 I now all men by these presents that we Anna Pierce Esq. J. Dillard and Jas
 Pierce a bold and fully bound unto Richard D. Smith Gentleman Judge of the
 Superior Court of Amherst County Virginia and to their successors in office in
 the sum of \$6000 current money of Virginia to which payment well and truly
 to be made we bind ourselves our heirs and assigns and our executors and administrators by these
 presents sealed with our seals and dated this 27th day of April 1821 and in the
 4th year of the commonwealth. The condition of the above obligation is that
 if the said Anna Pierce administrator of the goods chattels and credits of William
 Dillard decd. do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods
 chattels and credits of the said decd. which have or shall come to the hands possession
 or knowledge of him the said Anna Pierce or in the hands possession or knowledge of any
 other person as he or she and the same so made do exhibit into the Superior Court
 of Amherst when he shall be thereunto required by the said court and such goods chattels
 and credits do sell and truly administer according to Law and further do
 make a just and true account of his doings and dealings therein when thereto
 required by the said court and all the rest of the goods chattels and credits which
 shall be and remain in his hands
