In the name of God, amen, I William Mills of the County of Alexandria and State of Virginia, being of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament.

First, I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Eliza the use improvements and income of my dwelling house and lot wherein I now reside to have and to hold the same during her natural life to her own use and benefit.

Second, I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife all my household and kitchen furniture as it now stands in my house, or of which I shall die seized and possessed, to have and to hold the same to her and her Executors and administrators and assigns for ever.

Third, I give and bequeath all my other personal property after paying all my personal debts and funeral expenses to my beloved wife Eliza and my dear children, to be divided among them equal share for share. Sales goods and bequeath to my children after the death of my wife, the proceeds that may be realized from the sale of my real estate.

Wholly I do nominate and appoint Isaac Buckingham to be the sole Executor of this my last will and testament, and request that after the death of my wife, that my Executor or his heirs be required to sell my real estate and divided the proceeds among my children equal share for share, and in the event of the death of any one of my children before such sale, that portion which would have fallen to such child, shall be divided among the heirs of such child equal share for share.

In testimony whereof I have set my hand and seal and publish and declare this to be my last will and testament in presence of the witnesses named below this nineteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty eight.

To the County Court of Alexandria County:

Your Commissioner report to the Court, that on the 17 day of June 1869 J. Clinton Milburn, Executor of Benedict C. Milburn deceased, exhibited before your Commissioner, a statement of all the moneys which he the said J. Clinton Milburn, had received or become chargeable with or had disbursed, within the year ending May 6 1869 together with the vouchers for such disbursements. That your Commissioner embraced the said Executor, in the list of fiduciaries, whose accounts were before him for settlement, which was posted at the front door of the Court house of said County, on the first day of July Court last; and on the date of this report ten days having elapsed since the said account was mentioned in said list made up and completed the annexed account of J. Clinton Milburn as Executor aforesaid, and on the 6 day of May 1869, finds a balance of thirty five dollars and eighty nine cents due from the estate to the executor. Satisfactory vouchers have been submitted by the Executor.
