Your commissioner reports to the Court, that on the 25th day of October last, Arthur Herbert, the Committee, of Misses Betsey and Kitty Herbert, exhibited before your commissioner a statement of all the money, which he the said committee had received, or become chargeable with, or had disbursed, within two and a half years, to and on the 5th day of April 1869, together with the vouchers for such disbursements. That the commissioner embraced the said committee in the list of fiduciaries, whose accounts were before him for settlement, which was posted at the front door of the Courthouse of said County, on the first day of November Court 1868, and, on the date of this Report, [six days having elapsed since the said account was mentioned, in the said list,] made up and completed an account of the said committee, and, on the 5th day of April 1869, finds a balance of \$1177¹²/₁₀₀, will be due from the said committee to the said ladies. The account is supported by satisfactory vouchers and is herewith returned. Your commissioner further reports to the Court, that he has examined, whether the said committee has given such bond, as the law requires, and whether it is in a penalty, and with securities sufficient, and finds the same to be unobjectionable, and fully sufficient.

Will.

Be it remembered that, Thomas McEwen of Alexandria County of Alexandria, and State of Virginia desirous of making a different disposition of my property and Estate than what the law would make, declare the following as my last Will and Testament.

First. It is my desire that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid as soon after my decease as is practicable.

Second. I give and bequeath to my Nephew Richard McEwen, son of Edward McEwen the Frame House now occupied by James Whitney situated in Alexandria on the west side of Columbus street between Cronoko and Paulkton Streets with all the appurtenances thereto belonging to his own use and behoof forever.

Third. I give and bequeath to Olga Ann Springsteel the use and income of the Brick House where I now reside in Alexandria, aforesaid, situated on the west side of Columbus Street between Cronoko and Paulkton Streets, for the term of Ten Years, she paying the taxes thereon during that time. I also give and bequeath to her the said Olga Ann Springsteel all my Household furniture.

Fourth. I give and bequeath further to my Nephew Richard McEwen, son of Edward McEwen the Brick House where I now reside situated as aforesaid, subject to the Ten Years rent and use to the said Olga Ann Springsteel as aforesaid with all the appurtenances

thereto belonging, after the termination of the said ten years, to his own use and behoof forever.

Fifth. I have remeber all my other relatives and Brothers, heirs at law to my Estate and do not conclude to give them any thing.

Sixth. I hereby request that the Court appoint an Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this seventh day of January in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty Nine.
