 The undersigned your commission reports to the Court, that Michael
 Hart Guardian of Frederick William Hart a minor, child and sole heir of William
 Hart a deceased soldier, made application to your Commissioner for the
 settlement of his accounts, as Guardian as aforesaid, and did exhibit to
 your commissioner, a statement of the monies received by him as such Guardian,
 and he also exhibited an account of the monies paid out by him, as such
 Guardian, that due notice as required by law, setting forth that said state-
 ment was before me for settlement, was posted by me on the outer door of the
 courthouse, of said County, on the fourth day of May 1868, that being the first
 day of the May term of said County Court, and now on this 21st day of May 1868,
 ten days having elapsed since said account was made up and completed; Your
 commissioner doth find that the said Michael Hart Guardian as aforesaid has
 received the sum of one thousand three hundred and seven ⁷²/₁₀₀ Dollars (\$1067 ⁷²/₁₀₀)
 and has properly expended the sum of nine hundred and twenty three ⁷²/₁₀₀ Dollars
 (\$923 ⁷²/₁₀₀) and that there is a balance in his hands as Guardian, aforesaid the sum
 of three hundred and fourteen ⁷²/₁₀₀ Dollars as per statement of account herewith
 annexed. The accounts are supported by satisfactory vouchers.
