improvements thereon, together with all my freehold estate
to be held by her for her life only and after her death to ad-
dict to the children of Ann Matilda Gray her daughter, the
wife of John A. Gray.

I give and devise the rest and residue of my
estate real and personal, and my effects and credits unto the
said Caroline Lewis; and hereby constitute and appoint her
the Executrix of this my last will and testament.


