Lastly, I appoint my Cousin William G. Veaton, of Alexandria, Virginia Executor of this my last will and testament, and direct that no security shall be required of him as such, other than his own bond. If at any time my said Executor shall deem it prudent or expedient, to sell any portion of the estate or property of which I may be seized and possessed, he is authorized to do so, and to re-invest in such manner as he may deem most beneficial to those interested.
