settlement of his accounts, as Guardian as aforesaid, and did exhibit to
your Commissioner a statement of the monies received by him as such Guardian,
and he also exhibited an account of the monies paid out by him as such
Guardian, that due notice as required by law, setting forth, that said state-
ment was before me for settlement, was posted by me on the outer door of the
Courtroom of said County, on the fourth day of May 1868, that being the first
day of the May term of said County Court, and now on this 21st day of May 1868,
ten days having elapsed since said account was made up and completed; Your
commissioner doth find that the said Michael Hart, Guardian as aforesaid has
received the sum of one thousand three hundred and seven ⁷/₁₀ Dollars (\$1307 70)
and has properly expended the sum of nine hundred and sixty three ³/₁₀ Dollars
