Your commissioner reports to this Court, that on the 11th day of March, 1867, Elizabeth Sidwell, Agent, for the real estate of which W. Carter Corsey died seque^l, exhibited before your commissioner a statement of all the moneys, which she the said Elizabeth Sidwell had received or become chargeable with, or had disbursed, within the period commencing Sept. 15th 1865, and ending December 31st 1867, for which last named date her Agency ceased, together with proper vouchers for such disbursements. That your commissioner embraced the

said Agent, in the list of Fiduciaries, whose accounts were before him for settlement, which was posted at the front door of the Courthouse, of said County, on the first day of April last; and on the date of this Report (ten days having elapsed since the said account was mentioned in said list,) made up and completed the annexed account of the said Elizabeth Sidwell, as Agent of the real estate of W. And I further will devise that my executors & Executrix hereafter named, may close up, and if they think proper, carry on my present business as they may think proper.

And I further direct that they may exercise discretion in selling out my stock of goods, and investing the same

as they may deem best, for the interest of my wife and family
And I hereby appoint my wife Alice Barton & my son in law
William Logan Executor & Executrix of this my last Will and
Testament and request that the Court will require security from

Hart a deceased soldier, made application to your Commissioner for the
settlement of his accounts, as Guardian as aforesaid, and did exhibit to
your commissioner, a statement of the monies received by him as such Guardian,
and he also exhibited an account of the monies paid out by him, as such
Guardian, that due notice as required by law, setting forth that said state-
ment was before me for settlement, was posted by me on the outer door of the
Court house, of said County, on the fourth day of May 1868, that being the first
day of the May term of said County Court, and now on this 21st day of May 1868,
ten days having elapsed since said account was made up and completed; Your
commissioner doth find that the said Michael Hart Guardian as aforesaid has
received the sum of one thousand three hundred and seven ⁷¹/₁₀₀ Dollars (\$1307 71⁷¹/₁₀₀)
and has properly expended the sum of nine hundred and twenty three ⁸³/₁₀₀ Dollars
(\$923 83⁸³/₁₀₀) and that there is a balance in his hands as Guardian, of said sum
of three hundred and fourteen ¹⁶/₁₀₀ Dollars as per statement of account herewith
