In the Name of God, Amen: I, Robert Harrison, of Washington Township in the County of Alexandria and State of Virginia, being of sound mind and memory, and considering the uncertainty of life, do therefore make publick and declare this to be my last will and testament:

That is to say: First after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged the residue of my estate both real and personal I give to my wife during her natural life for her sole use and benefit and the support of my daughter Ophelia so long as she Ophelia remains single. If at any time my estate cannot be so managed that it will yield a comfortable support for them I then empower my wife by and through the advice and consent of my friend Geo. Ott Winder to sell one acre of land from the tract which in his judgment will be most advisable excepting that which will hereafter be set apart for my daughter Ophelia and the proceeds of said sale be used for the support of my wife and daughter Ophelia and so continue to sell but not more than one acre at any one time and only where he, Geo. Ott Winder is satisfied that it is actually necessary for the comfortable support of my wife and daughter Ophelia. After the death of my wife I give to my daughter Ophelia the following piece or parcel of land, to wit: Commencing at my South West Corner or the Corner where Payne's lot with mine Corners in the line of R. A. Phillips line thence Fifty yards with said Phillips line and about One hundred and ninety yards with Payne's line to a Cherry tree standing on the North side of the proposed Fairfax and Georgetown Turn Pike where said Pike leaves the land of Edward Biggs and enters on my land the other two lines to run parallel with the two lines described respectively out of which lot

of ground there shall be set apart in the North West corner twenty feet square which I forever reserve as a burial ground for myself and those of my family who may wish to be buried there. I also leave to my daughter Ophelia after the death of my wife all my household goods and personal effects. I also leave to my daughter Ophelia as belonging to the lot of ground set apart for her a sufficient right of way to and from use of the Spring from which we are now supplied with water. To each of the children of my daughter Sarah I leave one dollar. To my daughter America I leave one dollar. The remainder of my property after the death of my wife I give in equal portions to my children Thomas, Robert, Francis, Virginia and Alice. I like wise make and appoint my friend Geo. Ott Winder to be the executor of this my last will and testament. To see that its provisions are fully carried out in accordance with my wishes and should my wife die before my daughter Ophelia attains the age of twenty-one I desire him to become her guardian. I furthermore direct that he George Ott Winder shall have the settlement of my estate and superintend the division of my property and pay to the children of my daughter Sarah and also to my daughter America the one dollar left them I direct that any expense which may be incurred by the said Geo. Ott Winder as well as Compensation for his services be paid by my estate. In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the twenty-fifth day of August in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and seventy-three

To the Clerk of the County Court of said County:
We, J. B. Johnston, Henson Thompson and T. S. Wright, three freeholders of the said County do hereby certify that by virtue of a warrant to us directed by T. S. Wright, a Justice of the said County, we have this day on our parts viewed and appraised two cows and one calf taken up by James C. Roach on his land as estrays, and assess the value of the said estrays as follows: One Cow at twenty-five dollars, one at fifteen dollars and calf at three dollars. The Cow valued at twenty-five dollars is a red Cow with sleek horns, a bell on her neck, with white on her belly, and about four years old. The one valued at fifteen dollars is a dark red Cow about twelve years old with horns & marked with a cross & slit on the left ear and crop on the right. The Calf is a red and white bull and about three months old.
