I, Mary Massie, widow of Robert Massie, of the City of Alexandria, and State of Virginia, do make this, my last Will and Testament. First. It is my will and desire and I hereby direct, that the dwelling house, and lot of ground, devised to me by Catharine Horne, situated on the West side of Union, between King and Prince streets, in the said City of Alexandria, and which is particularly described in a deed, dated the 22nd day of March 1841, from George W. Denton and Mary his wife, and Robert Massie of record in the Clerk's Office of the County Court of Alexandria County Va. in Liber A. No. 3, folio 299, be sold and conveyed by my executor hereinafter named, and the proceeds of sale, divided between my daughter Sarah Ann Johnson, the wife of John M. Johnson of Washington City D. C. my daughter Martha L. Howard, the wife of William R. Howard; my daughter Mary Helen Wimsett, the widow of Wm H. Wimsett; and Ursula E. Massie, the wife of my son Rudolph M. Massie, the three last named, survivors being residents of the City of Alexandria Va. I direct that the proceeds be equally divided between said survivors, with the qualification that Mrs. Helen Wimsett, and Mrs. Ursula E. Massie shall each have one hundred dollars more than the other two survivors. Second. It is my will and I so direct, that so much of the proceeds of the sale of the house, and lot of ground, described in the foregoing clause, intended for the said Sarah Ann Johnson, Martha L. Howard, and Ursula E. Massie to held by my executor, in trust for their sole use and benefit, free and protected from the debts, and liabilities of their husbands, or any future husband either of them may have, but the said survivors may respectively hold and dispose of their several interests in all respects, as if they were sole and unmarried. Lastly. I hereby appoint my son Rudolph M. Massie Executor of this my last will and testament, and request the Court in which he may qualify, to dispense with security in his official bond.
