In the name of God, amen, I William Mills of the town of Alexandria, in the County of Alexandria and State of Virginia, being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament.

First. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Eliza the use improvements and income of my dwelling house and lot wherein I now reside to have and to hold the same during her natural life to her own use and benefit.

Second. I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife all my household and kitchen furniture as it now stands in my house, or of which I shall die seized and possessed, to have and to hold the same to her and her Executors and administrators and assigns for ever.

Third. I give and bequeath all my other personal property after paying all my personal debts and funeral expenses to my beloved wife Eliza and my dear children, to be divided among them equal share for share, I also give and bequeath to my children after the death of my wife, the proceeds that may be realized from the sale of my real estate.

Fourth. I do nominate and appoint Isaac Buckingham to be the sole Executor of this my last will and testament, and request that after the death of my wife, that my Executor or his heirs be required to sell my real estate and divide the proceeds among my children equal share for share, and in the event of the death of any one of my children before such sale, that portion which would have fallen to such child, shall be divided among the heirs of such child equal share for share.
