Appointed to all men once to die do make this my Last

Will & Testament And first I recommend my soul to God that
Gave it and my Body to the Earth to be decently Interred at

the discretion of my Executors Nothing Doubting but at the
General Resurrection I shall Receive it Again

And for that worldly Estate where with it hath pleased God to

Endow me I bequeath in the following manner I order that my
Debts be all paid by my Executors I give and bequeath unto

Margaret my beloved Wife one half of all my Goods & Chattels
of every kind also her Living and maintenance of my Plantation
while she lives and this Plantation to be managed by her as she

shall think fit I do hereby give and bequeath unto

Y^e good of my Body & the best I can be decently made
the discretion of my Executors Not Doubting but at the
General Resurrection I shall Receive it Again
And for that worldly Estate whereunto it hath pleased God to
Endow me I bequeath in the following manner I order that my
Debts be all paid by my Executors I leave and bequeath unto
Margaret my beloved Wife one half of all my Goods & Chattels
of every kind also her Living and maintenance of my Plantation
while she lives and this Plantation to be managed by her as she
And my Executors shall see fit till my Daughter Rachel come to
Maturity I leave and bequeath unto my Daughter Rachel
McClary the Plantation for so long with all my right Title &
Interest thereunto together with the other half of all my goods &
Chattels of every kind which Goods moveables of is my kind I order
to be Equally Divided between my Daughter Rachel and her Mother
I do also constitute and appoint Arch Alexander and Robt
Austin Executors of this my Last will & Testament And

To here by devanual And make Void all other Wills and Testaments
by me made heretofore published and pronounced my Last Testa-
ment in y^e presence of

At a Court held for Augusta County the 20th day of May 1752
This Last will & Testament of Alexander McCreary dead was in Open Court
proved by the oaths of Samuel Gray Moses Whitehead & Thomas McSpaden
the Witnesses thereto subscribed & ordered to be recorded & on the motion of
Archibald Alexander & Robert Huston the Esqrs therein named who
made oath according to Law & testified is granted them for obtaining
a Probate thereof in due form they having with Moses Whitehead &
Samuel Gray their securities entered into And Ackd. their bond according to
Law
