

In the Name of God Amen

I Andrew Boyd of the County of Augusta and Colony of Virginia formerly
being Sick and Weak of Body both of perfect Mind and Memory I thank
be given to almighty God, & calling to mind the Mortality of my body
knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to dye do make this my
last Will in Manner and form following that is to say principally I recom-
mend my soul to God who gave it and my body I comitt to the Earth to
be buried in a Christian like and Decent Manner, at the discretion of
my Executors and touching such worldly Estate wherewithall it
hath pleased God to Bless me I give and bequeath as followeth

I **give and bequeath** to my wellbeloved wife Rebecca
and to my two sons Thomas and John, all my Lands Goods Chattells
and Moveables of every kind to be equally Divided amongst them viz one
third part to my wife and one third part to each of my sons; I also
give and bequeath to my Cousin John White one Cow if he come to live here
I also order my wife and Children to keep two working horses two Hares
and three Cows and to sell the rest of my Cows and horses
I In case my Cousin John White come and Live three or four Years at
a Spring betwixt my Dwelling house and the half way Creek he is to have

a spring
a few otherwise not he is not to cut timber above eighteen inches diam
Safely I constitute and appoint James Fulton and my wife Rebecca
Executors of this my last Will. And I do hereby revoke, disannul and make
Void all other former Wills and Executors heretofore by me in any wife
made or executed. Ratifying and confirming and allowing this and no
other to be my last Will for witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this twenty Sixth Day of February 1749
before signing I allow my son Thomas my new house
Sealed and delivered
in the presence of

At a Court held for Augusta County the
22^d day of May 1750

This Last Will and Testament of Andrew Boyd deceased being presented unto
by Rebecca Boyd & James Fulton the Executors therein named was proved by the
oaths of William Hays and Jennet Boggs two of the Jurors thereof who
on oath declared that they saw Robert Alexander subscribe the same as an
witness, the said Will is admitted to record and on the Motion of the Exrs and their
performing which is usual in such Cases Certificate is granted them for that
a probate thereof in due form
