I Daniel Denniston of Beverley Wanner in Augusta County being very sick
and weak of Body but in perfect Mind and Memory Thats be given to God
therefore and calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it
is appointed for all Men once to dye do make and ordain this my last will and
Testament That is to say principally and first of all I give and

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I recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it. And for my body
I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner
at the discretion of my Ex^{ors} nothing doubting but at the general resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. And as touching
such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this
life I give bequeath and dispose of the same in the following manner
Imprimis I give and bequeath to Sarah my dearly beloved wife two
Cows one gray mare and the half of all the Moveables in the house and
the half of the profit of this years Crops after the Maintenance of the
family and decent Maintenance with Cloathing during her life. And
in case my son Daniel should marry and her his wife should not agree
with my beloved wife Sarah I leave her the only right of the house I
now live in during her life or a house to be built for her on the estate
at the discretion of the Executors —

Item I give my well beloved son Daniel Deniston all and singular my lands
Mesuages with all my other effects except the legacies mentioned or to be men-
tioned in this Will, and in case my beloved son Daniel should die without
Children then the said estate shall fall unto my daughter Ann Glasgow and
her Children

Item to my son in Law Patrick Glasgow five Shillings —

Item to my son in Law Patrick Kilaspy five Shillings

Item to my Daughter Mary Kilaspy one Bray horse Coll

Item to my grand Daughter Sarah Kilaspy a bay Coll two Years old

Item to my grand daughter Jean Kilaspy one halter two Years old

These Legacies to my son in Law, daughter & grand children to be immediately paid off at the discretion of my Executors
