should be buried in a good and decent order

I am order all my Debts should be paid

I am leave and bequeath to my well beloved wife Martha this dwelling house and
offices houses and all the plenishing that is in it excepting one bed and of Cloaths
and what is her daughter Elizabeths

I am order that my well beloved wife and my son Isaac should have a hundred
and fifty acres of Land if I find that my wife and my son Isaac do not agree

I am order that she should have her house and all the improvements and three cows
and the my horse and the road Ward and bread that is sufficient for her maintenance
and all that on Gross for while she lives

I am leave and bequeath to my son James one hundred acres of Land and all the
honors and profits

I leave and bequeath to my son Jacob one hundred acres of Land and the three
hundred and fifty acres of Land is to be equally divided allowing quantity &
quality one with the other according as it is judged

Item I order that I should be buried where my son John is buried and that
should be buried in a good and decent manner

Item I order all my Debts should be paid

Item I leave and bequeath to my well beloved wife Martha this dwelling house and
offices houses and all the plenishing that is in it excepting on bedding of Cloaths
and what is her daughter Elizabeths

Item I order that my well beloved wife and my son Isaac, should have a hundred
and fifty Acres of Land if in fact that my wife and my son Isaac dole not agree

I order that she should have her house and all the improvement and three Cows
and the myn Horse and the road Ward and bread that is sufficient forbs W. Cantanker
and all that on Groslope while she lives

Item I leave and bequeath to my son James one hundred Acres of Land and all that
honow doos possoss

I leave and bequeath to my son Jacob one hundred Acres of Land and the other one
hundred and fifty Acres of Land is to be equally divided allowing quantity &
quality one with the other according as it is judged

I leave and bequeath to my son Isaac, two Cows that is with calf a colt and a
little boy Ward

Item I leave and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth two Wild Cows her
house and beds and his furniture

leave and bequeath to my daughter Mary and her
order my well beloved wife and Hugh Martin the whole Executors
either this is my last will and testament. There is two pears that I
to pay for one Dutch Cow that I am indebted for, and the bay filly
that I may have to pay for her self given under my hand and seal
this ninth day of February in the year of our Lord God One thousand seven
hundred and forty seven Eight 1747-8

At a court hold for Augusta County the 17 day of May 1749
This last will and Testament of Isaac Anderson Esqr was presented into
Court by Martha Anderson one of the Executors named and being proved by
the oaths of Hugh Martin & Jacob Anderson the Witnesses thereof who admitted
the same And on the Motion of Martha Anderson who had sworn according to
certificate is granted her for obtaining a probate thereof in due form
and Hugh Martin & the other Executors named personally appeared in
Court and declared that he would not join in the probate or take on him
the burden of Execution of the said will
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
