James Robison of Augusta County in the Colony of Virginia a yeoman
being very sick and weak of Body but of perfect Mind and memory
Thanks be given to God therefore Calling to mind the Mortality of my
Body And knowing that it is Appointed for all men once to die do make and
Ordain this my Last Will and Testament, that is to say Principally and
first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that
gave it and for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a
Christian like and decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors
And as touching such worldly Estate where with it hath pleased God
to bless me I do give and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form. I Infirmus It is my will and
I do ordain that in the first place all my Just Debts and Funerall Charges
be paid And the residue I give and bequeath to my dear

Preserve the use and benefit of the Plantation which I now
live on during her Natural life or she continues my widow and
after her Death or marriage I go unto my two youngest sons
Isaac Robinson & Jonathan Robinson and I will them of their heirs
And Assign forever together with all my Stock and movables that
is remaining after the debts of Lagana is paid during the time
afore and after the above conditions or when she dies to have the
one third part of the Stock & movables at her own disposal to give
unto her Daughters or who she please and the other two thirds
to go unto the two youngest boys afore mentioned to them their heirs
and Assign forever. Item I give & bequeath unto my son Samuel
Robinson the sum of ten shillings current money of Virginia
Item I give and bequeath unto my son David Robinson two hund
Acres or there abouts of Land on the South side of the River Shannon
Where he now liveth. Item I give and bequeath unto my two you
est sons Isaac & Jonathan Robinson the Plantation where I now live
upon after their Mothers death or marriage to them their heirs and Assign
forever to be equally divided between them and mine heirs.

Where the now living I am & give and bequeath to my younger
est sons Isaac & Jonathan Robison the Plantation where I now live
upon after their Mothers death or marriage to them their heirs and assigns
forever to be Equally Divided between them and my son Isaac to live
on that part which I now live and to help his younger Brother with
a log house & black hotted acres of Land on his part -
Item I do hereby constitute make and ordain my loving wife
Mary Robison and my son David Robison my only and sole
Excutors this my Last will & Testament and I do hereby utterly
Disavow revoke and Dissuall all and every other former Testaments
Wills Legacies and Excutors by me in any way before this time
named written and bequeathed Manifesting and Confirming this and
Other to be my Last will & Testament I will these whereof I
hereunto set my hand & seal the day of year above written

Bryan and John Dobson are of the County of Augusta the
first Justice of the Commission of the Peace for Augusta County for And In behalf
And do the sole use And behoof of the Justices of the said County And their
successors in the sum of two hundred & fifty pounds to be paid to the said John
Lewis Gent & successors to the whole Payment well & truly to be paid we
bind Our selves And every of us And every of our heirs Executors And
Administrators jointly And severally firmly by these presents Sealed with our seals
Dated this 28th Day of May 1761

the Goods Chattels And Credits of the said Deceased which have or shall come
to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Mary Robinson or into the
hands or possession of Any other person or persons for her And the same so made do
exhibit in to the County Court of Augusta, at such time as the Court shall both or unto
required by the said Court And the same Goods Chattels And Credits And all
other the Goods Chattels of Credits of the said Deceased which at any time after shall
come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Mary Robinson or into the hands
And possession of Any other person or persons for her do and truly Administer
According to Law And further to make a just and true Account of her Adminy
And doings there in where there is required by this Court And also shall
will and truly pay and deliver all the Legacies Contained & specified in the said
Testament as for other Goods Chattels And Credits will thereunto extend and
the Law shall Charge them this Obligation to be void and of none Effect, unless
be remain in full force and Value
