Eliza Anna, Barbary & Catharina Rothgab what my dear wife Anna hath coming to her shall
have out of my Estate out of everything the third Part according to Law and shall live and have her
being in my Dwelling House, and shall run House with the children as long as live the said
again she shall keep the children and teach them to Read and Pray & Labour honestly and
what my Lawfull wife Anna what she hath brought to me shall be returned without fraud and
if my Lawfull wife should Marry she shall not leave the Place till my son John George
is at age and shall be no vantage after the appraisment if it should happen that my Lawfull
wife or husband if she should Marry and keep an indifferant house and destroy the Estate
then the Executors shall have the Power to Regulate the said will in the best form of this my last
will and I beg & pray for Letters & Guardian Paul Lung & my Dear wife Anna Rothgab in
Witness whereunto I have set my hand this 19th day of December 1751
