

# In the name of God Amen

The Sixth day of January in the Year of our Lord 1742-50.

I John Woodley of Augusta County and Colony of Virginia, being very sick and Weak, in body but perfect Mind and Memory Thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto Mind the Mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all Men once to dye, do make & ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it & for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent Manner, at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall rise with the same again by the Mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following Manner & form

First I give my Willers and I do order in the forth place that all my Just debts and funeral Charges be paid and satisfied  
Item I will and bequeath unto my Son Jacob Woodley five Shillings Sterling money of England  
Item I will and bequeath unto my son in Law Nicholas Sea haven all the remainder of my Estate and the Mares that my son Jacob Woodley lost at Rockfish if they get her, and if he doth not get the Mares to pay to Nicholas Sea haven seven pounds current Money of Pennsylvania and like wise two pieces of Eight that I lent to my son Jacob to Nicholas Sea haven

Money of Pennsylvania and like wife now living  
 he shall pay to Nicholas Seaven  
 Lastly I like wife constitute and make and ordain my son in Law Nicholas Seaven  
 my only and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament And I do hereby utterly  
 disallow revoke and disannul all and every other Testaments Wills Legacies and Executors  
 by me in any ways before this time named willed and bequeathed ratifying and confirm-  
 ing this and no other to be my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have  
 hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and Year above written  
 Signed Sealed published and declared by the  
 John Woodley to be his last will & Testament  
 in the presence of his two subscribers
