will and Testament that is to say principally

and first of All I give and recommend my soul into the hands

my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the Mighty Power of God and
as touching such Wordly Estate wherewith it hath pleased

Item my will is and I do order that my wellbeloved wife

is and I do order that my son Robert Milloapo and Thomas

Milloapo shall have their Equal shares of my Movable
Item my will is and I do Order that my Daughter Jean
Macgee shall have five Shillings Sterling my will is I do
Order that my Daughter Elizabeth Allen have her part
of the Movable Item my will is and I do Order that my
son Joseph Milloapo and my son William Milloapo shall
have my land Equally Divided between them and my son
Joseph shall have that part of my Land that is called Robin
Cabin and joyning on William barrels land and on
my lands line to him his heirs and assigns forever and
likewise his part of the Movable Item my will is and I
do Order that my son William Milloapo shall have the
Other Part of My land where I now live to him his
heirs and assigns forever only that my Wife shall have
that part of it as is above Mentioned to her during her
Widewhood or life and then my son William shall have it
