I doe will and constitute as followeth first of all I commit my
soul to god who gave it hoping through the merits of Christ
to find mercy in the next place I will that my body when dead
my be buried in an orderly and decent manner as time and
place will afford as to what worldly goods god hath bestowed
on me I will and order the following direction to be made
use of first I will and bequeath to my loving wife Mary
a black pasing mear and a young bay mear and up
cows and an equal part with the children to my son
John and Wistal I will and bequeath a tract of land laying
in the cow pasture joining James Meas to be equally divided
betwixt them and also to John his own mear and the young

use of part I will and bequeath to my loving wife margt
a black pasing mear and a young bay mear and up
cows and an equal part with the children to my sons
John and Asaph I will and bequeath a tract of land laying
in the cow pasture joining James Meest to be equally divided
between them and also to John his own mear and the young
stallion and for Asaph his own bay mear and young daughter
Jean I will and bequeath a mear called spot and a other
called canch and a young black mear with a white rack
in her face and to Samuel I will and bequeath a tract of
land laying on Jacksons River and to my sons Robert and
James I will and bequeath the tract of land flux on to be
equally divided between them only my wife margt shall
have the living and management of said place in her own

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Hence untill said Robert and James comes of age or their Mary and Tom
son dies? I will and bequeath a black mare with a snip and a cow and
if my wife dies a white I will and bequeath a grey mare to it and as for
the rest of my goods I leave the management and disposal of to my
loving wife Margrath Crocket and Robert Davis whom I do wife &
Confidants make and ordain my only and sole heirs: there is no other
to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal the day and year above written
