the 27th day of January in the Year of our Lord 1748
Hill of the County of Augusta and Colony of Virginia I being
Sick and weak in body but of perfect Mind and Memory thanks be
given to God the Lord calling to mind the Mortality of my body and
knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to dye do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say first of all
I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of God that gave it and
my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and
decent Manner at the Discretion of my Ex^{rs} and as for my worldly
Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this Life I give devise
and dispose of the same in the following Manner and form
I certify it is my Will and I do ordain that in the first place all my
Just Dotts and General Charges be paid and Satisfied
I then I give and bequeath unto several to wit my Dearly beloved Daughters
and James Hill & Mary Hill and John Hill and Joseph Hill and Hannah
Hill and Rachel & Elizabeth Hill my Dearly beloved Children Eight
parts out of ten of all My Goods and Chattels
I then I give and bequeath unto Mary my Dearly beloved Wife to

two parts out of my Estate, that is to say as Much as two of the Children and the
Land with the improvements during her life time and after her death the Land
shall be my son Joseph
This wife constitute and ordain Mary Hill my Dearly beloved wife
to be my only and sole Ex^r with Thomas Moore of this my last will and
Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the Day and Year above written

At a Court held for Augusta County the 17 day of May 1749
The Last will and Testament of W^m Hill deced was presented into Court by
Mary Hill and Thomas Moore the Ex^r: therein named who made
oath thereto according to Law and being proved by oaths of John Dobehin
and Isaac Johnson two of the witnesses thereto is admitted heretofore
and on y^e Motion of the Ex^r: their performing what is hereunto
in Due form is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof
