Dear and Loving wife Sarah I give and bequeath to her her mair and
Saddle And bid I turn to my eldest Son John I give and bequeath a Tract
of Land containing two hundred and thirty seven Acres on Jackson River and
also my best Tract of Close I turn And I also allow four hundred Acres
of Land to be purchased of the Estate for my Sons George and Andrew
I turn the Plantation I now live on I give and bequeath to my Son William
I turn I constitute And Appoint my Dear and Loving Wife to be
whole and Sole Executor And manager of the whole Affairs while she remains
my widow but if she marry she shall only have the above mentioned -
