The 10th day of October 1749. William Magill of Quincy County being sick in body but of perfect mind and Memory thanks be to God calling to Remembrance the uncertain State of this transitory Life and that all flesh must yield to Death when it shall please God to call do make constitute ordain and declare this my last Will and Testament in Manner and form following revoking and annulling and by these presents all and every Testament and Testaments Will and Wills I heretofore made by me and declared either by word or writings and this to be taken only for my last will and Testament & no other.

And first being sorry from the bottom of my heart for my sins past present and desiring forgiveness for the same. I give and commit my soul to God my Saviour and Redeemer, in whom and by the Merits of Jesus Christ I believe to be saved and to have full remission & pardon of all my sins and that my soul with my body at a General Day of Resurrection shall rise again with joy and thro' the Merits of Christ shall and pass on to possess & inherit the Kingdom of heaven prepared for his Elect and chosen, and my body to be buried in such a place where it shall please my Ex^{or} hereafter to appoint. And now disposing of my temporal Estate & such goods Chattels & Debts as it shall please God above my debts to bestow upon me. I do order give and dispose as followeth That is to say. First I will that all my Debts and dues that I owe in right

shall well and truly be paid

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taken only for my last will and Testament & no other.
And first being sorry from the bottom of my heart for my sins past present
desiring forgiveness for the same. I give and commit my soul to God my dear
and Redeemer, in whom and by the merits of Jesus Christ I believe to be
Saved and to have full remission & pardon of all my sins and that my soul
with my body at a general Day of Resurrection shall rise again with
and thro' the merits of Christ death and passion pass on & inherit the Kingdom
of heaven prepared for his Elect and chosen, and my body to be buried in such
a place where it shall please my Ex^r hereafter to appoint. And now disposing
of my temporal Estate & such goods Chattels & Debts as I have I give
above my debts to be paid upon me. I do order give and dispose as follows
That is to say. First I will that all my Debts and dues that I owe in right
and Conscience to any person or persons whatsoever, shall well and truly be paid
within convenient time after my decease by my Executors I order my wife Mary
to have Six of the best of the Cows and on a day two year old Mare, and the best
of the household plenishing: & the Gray Mare to her son David Gass, and as
my land I order it to be divided between my sons James & William, and the
to run a straight course from a rood by the trigger end of James's Meadow
towards a little spring between and Charles Campbell's and James's to have
and he and his or and William the said I now live on

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I order my Son John to have the young bay Yearling mare. And as for the rest of the young Cattle I order them to be equally divided among my 6 children. And like wise my hogs I order them to be divided equally between my wife and my Children. I order my brown Coat for my Son John, and the white Coat to William and the half of the household Goods to William & one half to be excepted for my wife more than her equal Share and the pewter & one job to my wife as for her equal Share. I order my Grandchild James son to have one half of all I own. I order my wife Share of the Creatures and William and Elizabeth to be maintained on my plantation this winter, And my funeral charges to be taken out of the whole Estate. My saddle and other Tools I order them with the gloves to be given to William and the big Bible I leave it to James as witness my hand this tenth day of October 1749. I order Robert Craven and Hugh Campbell to be my Exrs. Memorandum before signing William is to have the black mare & gray horse.
