The Commonwealth of Virginia to the Sheriff of Walth County Greeting we command you that you Summon and Impannel Twelve fit persons to meet upon the lands of Thomas Mitholam on the waters of Swan Creek whereon he proposeth to build a water Crust Mill on the second Monday in April next and that you charge the said Jurymen impartially and to the best of their Skill and Judgment to view the said Lands so proposed to be build on and to enquire whether and in what degree fish of passage and ordinary navigation will be obstructed whether by any and by what means such obstruction may be removed and whether in their opinion the health of the Neighbourhood will be annoyed by the Stagnation of the waters and that you Return the Inquest of the said Jurors duly Signed under their hands and seals to the next April Court also this writ witness Charles Cameron Clerk of our said Court at the Court House the 15th day of February 1796 and 20th year of the fourth
