This Bill of Sale from Samuel Green to Thomas Hickenbottom was Presented to me in my Office and the above Regiments being taken and certified by Isaac Hutchinson Clerk of Monroe County was admitted to Record Pete 6th Francisco C.R.

I Andrew Warrick of the county of Bath and state of Virginia being of sound mind do make this my last will and Testament in form following that is to say I desire that my negroes Israel, Ben, Abram, Henry, Bigotid, big Rachel, Amy and her four children, namely Gibah, Sarah, Nancy, and Julia, Alice and her two children, Jefferson, and Angelina, Martha and her child be sold for the purpose of paying my just debts. - Secondly - I will and bequeath unto my wife Martha the lower end of my farm on which I now live extending up the river so as to include my little mill with a straight line from line to line except the bottom

Thirdly - I will and bequeath unto my wife Martha a certain tract of land containing three hundred and one acres lying between Jackson River and Rock Creek commonly known by the name of Millard Place in the county of Bath - Fourthly, I will and bequeath a certain tract of land containing three hundred and sixty one acres, on the West side of my house tract to my wife Martha it lying & being in the county of Bath the above named lands I will & bequeath to my wife Martha during her natural life to do with as she may think proper and then it is my will that the said lands revert to my little daughter Rachel & her heirs forever! - Fifthly I do will and bequeath to my wife Martha a Negro girl named Abby until my daughter Mary arrives at the age of sixteen years at which time it is my will that said Abby be given to her and her heirs forever. - Sixthly I also will bequeath unto my wife Martha my trusty man Peter London during her natural life then it is my will that said Peter London be equally divided between my two daughters Mary & Rachel - Seventhly - I will and bequeath to my wife Martha my Negro man Jim, Venus and his four children, namely - Israel, Abram, Rachiah, and John, until my two daughters Mary and Rachel shall arrive at the age of twenty one years at which time it is my will that the above names Jim, Venus & his four children Israel, Abram, Rachiah and John, be equally divided between them the said Abby and Rachel. - Eighthly - I will and bequeath unto my wife Martha all my Household and Pictures furniture until my two daughters Mary & Rachel arrive at the age of twenty one years at which time it is my will that the one half of said furniture be equally divided between them the said Mary and Rachel, the other half to be equally divided between Abby and Rachel after the death of my wife Martha - Ninthly - I do will and bequeath unto my three sons James Warrick, Jacob Warrick and John J. Warrick to each of them a good feather bed

and quantum so soon as they arrived at the age of twenty one years - ¹⁰⁰ Thirtieth, I will and bequeath unto my daughter Mary one certain tract of land called my Upper place and known by the name of the Haulp Place containing one hundred acres. also another tract of land containing ⁷¹ seventy one acres adjoining the above tract of one hundred acres lying on Jacksons River, also one other tract of land called the Shoe-¹¹⁶ maker place containing one hundred and ¹⁵ seventy two acres adjoining the above tract lying on the Bensley Ridge containing two hundreds and forty six acres; also sixty eight acres of land adjoining the Haulp place the above tract or parcels of land being and lying in the county of Bath on Jacksons River & the waters thereof to the said Mary & her heirs forever - ¹⁶ Eleventhly, I will and bequeath unto my daughter Rachel Warwick a certain tract or parcel of land containing five hundred and ninety six acres said land lying and being in the county of Pocahontas it being the land I purchased from Andrew W. Warwick one Riding Horse saddle & Bridle of a good quality to them & their heirs forever - Eighteenthly I will and bequeath to my wife Martha the balance or ¹⁸ remaining part of a certain tract or parcel of land adjoining the lower end of my home tract after reserving a part which was purchased by Andrew W. Cameron
