I, Samuel S. Warwick of the county of Bath and State of Virginia being of sound mind do make this my last will and Testament in form following that is to say. I desire that my Negroes Isaac, Ben Absolam, Henry, Big Kid, by Rachel, my and her four children, namely Gilbert Isaac, Nancy, Julia, Alice and her two children, Jefferson, and Angelina, Martha and her child be sold for the purpose of paying my just debts. - Secondly - I will and bequeath unto my wife Martha the house and of my farm on which I now live extending up the River so as to include my little mill with a shafts line from line to line across the bottom

Thirdly - I will and bequeath unto my wife Martha a certain tract of land containing three hundred and one acres lying between Petersens Jacksons Field and Backs Creek commonly known by the name of Marlins Place in the county of Bath. - Fourthly, I will and bequeath a certain tract of land containing three hundred and sixty one acres on the West side of my home tract to my wife Martha it lying & being in the county of Bath the above named land I will & bequeath to my wife Martha during her natural life to do with as she may think proper and then it is my will that the said land be re-sold to my little daughter Rachel & her heirs to have & her heirs forever. - Fifthly, I do will and bequeath to my wife Martha a Negro Girl named Eliza until my daughter Mary arrives at the age of sixteen years at which time it is my will that said Eliza be sold & to her and her heirs forever. - Sixthly, I do will & bequeath unto my wife Martha my trusty man Peter & Son during her natural life then it is my will that said Peter & Son be equally divided between my two daughters Mary & Rachel. - Seventhly - I will and bequeath to my wife Martha my Yellowman Jew, Venus and her four children, namely - Isaac, Aaron, Rachariah and John until my two daughters Mary and Rachel shall arrive at the age of twenty one years at which time it is my will that the above named Jew, Venus & her four children Isaac, Aaron, Rachariah and John, be equally divided between them the said Mary and Rachel. - Eighthly - I will and bequeath unto my wife Martha all my household and Riches furniture until my two daughters Mary & Rachel arrive at the age of twenty one years at which time it is my will that the one half of said furniture be equally divided between them the said Mary and Rachel, the other half to be equally divided between Mary and Rachel after the death of my wife Martha. - Ninthly, I do will and bequeath unto my three sons Samuel S. Warwick, Jacob Warwick and John S. Warwick each of them a good Feather Bed

and granted to soon as they arrived at the age of twenty one years. - Twelfthly, I will and bequeath unto my daughter Mary one certain tract of land called my upper place and known by the name of the Wandy place containing one hundred Acres. also another tract of land containing seventy one Acres adjoining the above tract of one hundred Acres lying on Jacksons River, also one other tract of land called the Three-makes place containing one hundred and seventy six Acres. also one other tract lying on the Binsley Ridge containing two hundred and forty six Acres; also sixty eight Acres of land adjoining the Wandy place the above tracts or parcels of land lying and being in the county of Bath on Jacksons River & the Waters thereof to the said Mary & her heirs forever. - Eleventhly, I will and bequeath unto my daughter Rachel & Edmund a certain tract or parcel of land containing five hundred and ninety six Acres said land lying and being in the County of Pocahontas it being the land I purchased from Andrew W. Cameron and adjoining the lands of Andrew Sitlington to her and her heirs forever. - Twelfthly, I will and bequeath unto my three sons James W. Warwick Jacob Warwick and John W. Warwick the balance of my home tract of land in which I now live beginning with the straight line above my Cedar trees extending up the river so as to include the balance of said tract after taking out the part ^{divided} to my wife Martha during her natural life & up to join the lands devised to my daughter Mary to them and their heirs forever. - Thirteenthly, I will and bequeath unto my three sons James W. Warwick Jacob Warwick & John W. Warwick & my daughter Mary Warwick one certain tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and ninety Acres, lying and being in the County of

Bath on the east side of Jacksons River, adjoining my home tract to them and their heirs forever. - Fourteenthly, I will and bequeath unto my three sons James W. Warwick Jacob Warwick and John W. Warwick one certain tract of land containing four hundred Acres known by the name of Clove Creek lying & being in the County of Pocahontas & being the land devised to William Woods & his wife by Jacob Warwick dec'd & sold by said Woods to me also one other tract or parcel of land containing two hundred Acres adjoining the above tract of land at the lower end thereof which was devised to William Woods by Jacob Warwick dec'd & sold to me lying & being in the County of Pocahontas. - also one other tract or parcel of land joining the first mentioned tract containing four hundred Acres the said land joins said first mentioned tract at the upper end and extending up on both sides of Clove Creek also one other tract or parcel of land containing forty Acres lying and being in Greenidge River and known by the name of Brown place also one other tract or parcel of land containing four hundred and twenty seven Acres lying and being on the West side of Clove Creek survey and joining said land the above tracts or parcels of land lying and being in the County of Pocahontas and are the same land devised to William Woods by Jacob Warwick dec'd & sold by said Woods to me, to them and their heirs forever. - Fifteenthly, I will and bequeath unto my beloved ^{wife} Martha six mule cows, two brood mares and one riding horse & saddle to be chosen by her or to her and her heirs forever. - Sixteenthly, My will is that all my personal estate which I have not devised be sold and after all my just debts are paid the balance thereof be equally divided between my wife Martha and my children Seventeenthly, I will and bequeath to my three sons James W. Warwick Jacob Warwick & John W. Warwick one riding horse saddle & bridle of a good quality to them & their heirs forever. - Eighteenthly, I will and bequeath to my wife Martha the balance or remaining part of a certain tract or parcel of land adjoining the lower end of my home tract after deducting a part which was purchased by Andrew W. Cameron

and permitted to soon as they arrived at the age of twenty one years. Twelfthly, I will and bequeath unto my daughter Mary one certain tract of land & called my upper place and known by the name of the Handley place containing one hundred Acres. also another tract of land containing Seventy one Acres adjoining the above tract of one hundred Acres lying on Jacksons River, also one other tract of land called the Shoemaker place containing one hundred and Seventy six Acres. also one other tract lying on the Brushy Ridge containing two hundred and forty six Acres; also sixty eight Acres of land adjoining the Handley place the above tracts or parcels of land lying and being in the county of Bath on Jacksons River & the waters thereof to the said Mary & her heirs forever. Eleventhly, I will and bequeath unto my daughter Rachel & Warwick a certain tract or parcel of land containing five hundred and ninety six Acres said land lying and being in the county of Pocahontas it being the land I purchased from Andrew W. Barron and adjoining the lands of Andrew Sittlington to her and her heirs forever. Twelfthly, I will and bequeath unto my three sons James W. Warwick Jacob Warwick and John W. Sixteenthly, My will is that all my personal estate which I have not devised be sold and after all my just debts are paid the balance thereof be equally divided between my wife Martha and my children Seventeenthly, I will and bequeath to my three sons James W. Warwick Jacob Warwick & John W. Warwick one Riding Horse saddle & bridle of a good quality to them & their heirs forever. Eighteenthly, I will and bequeath to my wife Martha the balance or remaining part of a certain tract or parcel of land adjoining the lower end of my home tract after dividing a part which was purchased by Andrew W. Barron

during her natural life at which time it is my will that it be sent to my daughter Rachel L. Warwick to her and her heirs forever. Nineteenth and lastly I do appoint Robert Beaton and Mrs D Wincale Executors to this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills by me made.
