In the Name of God Amen: I Am Ginny Pullin of Bathspine Bath County Virginia being very sick and weak in perfect mind and memory, thanks be unto God; Calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed unto for all men to die do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto the hand of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be interred in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God; and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form First, I give and bequeath at my decease freedom to my black woman Daphy she is to be clearly set at liberty immediately after my burial, and to have her spinning wheel clear of all expences Secondly, I give to my wife beloved daughter Martha Henry a little black girl Amy, she being about four years old; she my daughter Martha Henry is to have the said black girl clear of all demand; Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved daughter Ginny Afil a black child named

Winnale (she being at this time about ten months old) she my daughter Ginny shall is to have the same black child at my decease clear of all expenses; Fourthly, It is my desire to give unto my son Thomas Pullin a young Grey mare he my son Thomas Pullin is to have my young Grey mare at my decease clear of demand; fifthly, I give to my grand daughter Eleanor Pullin (the late John Pullins daughter a feather bed and bolster, with quilted cover blanket and one sheet, she my grand daughter Eleanor Pullin is to have the same without demand; Sixthly and lastly, the Remainder of my property I will to be sold by public auction and the money disposed of in the following manner, viz? first all just demands to be honestly paid, together with my funeral expenses rightly settled, and secondly the rest of the money raised (from my remaining property being disposed of to be equally divided amongst my sons and daughters then living at the time of my decease or when the division takes place) signed sealed and published as my last will and testament in the presence of us also in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names
