know all men by these presents that I William Oliver of Bath County & State of Virginia do give grant bargain & sell, and by these presents have given granted bargain & sold unto John Davis Merchant of the same County & State, for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred fifty dollars lawful money of Virginia, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge & him the said John Davis his heirs & assigns thereof & thenceforth I of & from every part thereof I the said William Oliver do acquit & discharge the following property to wit: One Negro man slave named Lewis, one Negro Woman slave named Phoebe, & her child Lewis, one dark bay mare three years, to have & to hold unto the said John Davis his heirs and assigns forever, to the only proper use & behoof of him the said John Davis his heirs & assigns, and I the said William Oliver do covenant to warrant & defend the title & property in & to the said hereby bargain & sold property unto him the same John Davis his heirs & assigns forever. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day of May 1803
