My Soul I recommend to God in an humble hope of a blessed Immortality through the mediation of my blessed redeemer - My Body I direct to be buried in a decent manner at the direction of my Executors herein after mentioned - With regard to such temporal Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me, I do give and bequeath of in the manner and form following to Wit - First I direct that all my estate real and personal shall remain under the control & direction of my dear wife Elizabeth Thomson until my Grandson Charles T Taylor shall attain to the age of twenty one years - at which period I direct that a Division thereof shall be made into two equal parts or moieties, one of which part

or Minutes I desire to my said wife Elizabeth & her heirs to be disposed of in such manner as she shall think proper - The remaining part, I desire to my two Grand Children Charles T Taylor & Sarah A. E. A. County being now in reasonable health and mind and
desirous Money and calling to mind the uncertainty
of life do make and appoint this my last Will and
Testament touching all other Wills heretofore by me
made but this only — And as for my Wadly Estate
I give and bequeath it in the following Manner that
is to say I hereby order and direct that all my just
Debts and funeral expenses be paid as soon as con-
venient I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Sarah the third part of my lands or the profits thereof
during her natural life also her bed and Furniture
and the Room in the back shade and the other end
of the shade where she now sleeps and also the slaves
Phillis, Lou and Matilda during her life, and then
with their increase to my son William to be divided
between him and my two daughters Esther and Margaret
an Appraisement equally to all them and at
Williams choice to keep or let go the said slaves
so estimated. Also I further give to my beloved wife
the one half of my stock of cattle exclusive of those of
my sons which came by his Grand Father and likewise
one third of the sheep and hogs and one fourth
part of my stock of horses and until Margaret is
married and a division is made to be maintained
as here to fore — I give to my son William the planta-
tion wherein I now live as also a son all lot of land
on Greenbrier River below John Marion to him heirs
and a proper portion also my stall and traps belong-
ing to him also my wagon and farming utensials
of every kind and what of my horses is now dead
on the farm likewise my Surveying Instruments
and their parts of my Books and also the slaves David
Tom and Anna and the infant named James Marion
to him and his heirs forever likewise two Beds and
their furniture two Tables half dozen chairs and
a large Bullock and a half of the kitchen furniture
I give to my Daughter Esther and companion unto
her all the furniture she has got also the two female
slaves Lou and Rose also one small tract of land
named Rock and Rose also one small tract of land
