Now all men by their Presents that Nathaniel Whitman of Bath County in the State of Virginia have married and constituted and by their Presents do Name and appoint and make Abraham Black and Henry Black of Hardy County in the State of Virginia my true and faithful attorney for me and in my Name and to my use to Demand due for me and for me on certain part or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Bucks in the State of Pennsylvania and Macarism Township and being in George Appleback and Samuel Morris Lands which said Lands belonged to John Henry New Deceased giving and hereby granting unto my said attorney my full power and authority to use and exercise all such Acts things and services in the Law as shall be necessary for recovering of the said Land and to make and give Acquittances or other Discharges in my Name and generally to do and execute in the Premises as fully as I myself might or could do being personally present satisfying confirming and allowing all and whatsoever my said attorney shall lawfully and lawfully do in virtue of the Power of these presents. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twentieth day of November one thousand seven hundred and Ninety two
