Greary of Bath County in the State aforesaid a Tract of Land in fee simple Containing four hundred Acres lying the residue of a Tract of Land Containing fourteen hundred Acres (one thousand of which were conveyed to Roland Madison by the same more or less) lying and being in the County of Dorchester in the Waters of South River and known by the Name of Dorchester's improvement and I do hereby authorize and appoint the said John M. Greary for me and in my Name to execute sign seal and deliver a Deed of Conveyance in fee simple for the Land aforesaid and to do all other Lawful Acts and Things whatsoever concerning the premises as I myself could do were I personally present.
