In the name of God Amen I Daniel Mathany of the County of Bath and State of Virginia Being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all once to die do make ordain and constitute this my last will and testament in form following Viz: First I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the glorious

resurrection to receive the same by the mighty power of God and as for my worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give bequeath and dispose of the same in the manner and following viz - Secondly I will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid from the Sale of my Stock and farming utensils Then I give and bequeath to my loving wife Sarah one equal half of all my house hold furniture, and one third of my land as long as she lives. Then 3^d I give and bequeath to my two Sons Levi and Abijah all my land that I own as paper on which I now reside being one hundred acres exclusive of the one third to my wife Sarah her lifetime and then that to be theirs by them allowing my daughter Susannah a living one the land so long as she remains unmarried, Then 5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Susannah my young brown mare two years old past - Then 6th I give and bequeath to my daughter Cecilia Boyd the sum of one hundred dollars to be paid to her by my two sons Levi and Abijah - Then 8th I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah one third of all my property not otherwise disposed of. Then 9th I give and bequeath to my three daughters Nancy Susannah and Cecilia an equal part of all my property not hereby otherwise disposed of - I do hereby nominate and appoint my two Sons Levi and Abijah Executors to this my last Will and Testament in every point for the good of all my children and I do also deny revoke and disannul every other Will or Wills by me made and ratify this to be my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirty first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us and in the presence of each other
