In the Name of God Amen. This twentieth day of November 1804 I Elizabeth Rhica of the County of Bath and State of Virginia being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God for it therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament and first of all I give and bequeath my soul unto the hands of almighty God that gave it and

my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executor nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God; and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless in this life I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form, first I give and bequeath to every one of my Grand children and great Grand children which is called Elizabeth or Betsey by Name one bible and Watts hymns, secondly I give and bequeath to my son William Rhica and all my Grand sons which is William by Name one bible and Watts hymns to each of them, thirdly I give and bequeath to my son Robert Rhica one bed with all the cloze belonging to the same to him and his heirs forever fourthly I give and bequeath to my son Alexander Rhica seven pounds to be paid in money to him and his heirs forever, fifthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Laughrags my bed in the little room and all the cloze belonging to it also my wearing apparel to her and her heirs forever, sixthly I give and bequeath to my Grand child Ann Rhica daughter to my son John Rhica one bed and bedstead with all the furniture belonging to the same also her choice of my yearlings hiffers to her and her heirs forever, seventhly I give and bequeath to my son John Rhica my yearling bull to him and his heirs forever, eighthly I give and bequeath to my son William son Robert Rhica by Name one book called whitefield sermons, Ninthly, I Order and allow my three Negro children named Samuel and Toby and Ben to be sold with their mother together with all my horses, cows, sheep and hogs including house furniture with all my personal estate to be sold which have not been heretofore mentioned and the monies arising from the sale of said property I order and allow to be equally divided between all my children who is now living,

and the children of my sons Archibald and James Rhia who is
 dead meaning seven shares. Truly I order and allow my ne-
 groe man Thomas eight dollars to be paid in cash and one
 Rifle gun and a mans saddle which he now claims. I
 likewise order and allow eight dollars to be paid in cash to
 my negroe woman daughterney, and I wish none of my
 licks to be sold but to be equally divid between my chil-
 dren, and I likewise constitute make and Ordain James
 Kelso and John Rhia to be my sole exors of this my
 last will and Testament

 leged by the said Elizabeth
 Rhia as her last will and
 Testament in presence of us
