annual payments I also leave her my negroes Tom, and Isaac Rachel
and her daughter Phoebe Lane, and any other slave which she may
have during her natural life and at her decease I will them to be

Fourthly. Whereas my millborough real estate is under a lease to Sam^t Williams
Leases 40th of the Williams which will not expire until the 25th of December
One thousand eight hundred and twenty eight, at which time or sooner
if they ^{conceas} will be sold for the best price that can be had on a
credit of one, two, three, four, five, six, and seven years clear of interest
if punctually paid and the payments secured by a deed of trust on the
land. Also I will that my cabin Draft land be sold in the same way
the proceeds of which sales shall be a fund for the following
purposes herein after named.

I thank that I have given to my son John H Williams about \$750.00 and I think I have given to my son Elisha Williams \$600.00 including his trade which amounts \$300. more I will that the above criterion to go by is to make all my children equal I think I have given to my son Sam'l Williams about \$550. I think that I have given to my son Justinius Williams about \$350. including his trade I think that I have given to my son Marcus Williams about \$150. and my son the Williams about \$70. I think I have given my daughter Anna Davis about \$170. and I think I gave my daughter Nancy Bruffey about \$150. I also will that there be paid unto my son Sam'l Williams the sum of \$350. out of the fund produced from the sale of the Millborough real Estate by my Executors hereinafter named.
