In the Name of God Amen. I Hugh McDannald of the County of Bath and State of Virginia being far advanced in years; but of a sound mind and memory calling to mind my mortality, do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament in manner following:-

I commend my soul to God who gave it and my Body to the Earth to be decently interred in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors in hope of a glorious Resurrection at the last Day:-

With regard to the worldly goods that God hath bestowed on me. I Will in the first place my Will is that all my just and lawful debts be paid. 2nd I Will and bequeath to my Son John McDannald all the Power part of my landed property with all its appurtenances and the dividing Line to be established and permanently fixed as I shall now prescribe that is the division Line to commence with the River at the upper end of the new bottom the River to be the line drawn unto the mouth of the second stream hollow from the gap Run continuing up said draw from the mouth a straight direction until it unites with my Brother John's line on the top of the Hill the other part of the Dividing line to begin at the same place running up the River until the first low Gap in the Hill thence running an east south west course to my Back line.

3rd I will and bequeath to my son John McDannald two Negro Women and their increase namely Bill and Charlotte. - 4th I Will and bequeath to my Son John McDannald one half of my Waggon 5th I Will and bequeath to my Wife Elizabeth McDannald the upper end of my landed property but to be confined at the lower end by the above mentioned boundaries with a reserve of two locations which I have not fully effected. -

6th I Will and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth McDannald my Slaves namely One Negro Woman named Ellasone Do Died one Boy named Charles One Girl named Harriet Do Do named Hetty one Boy named George one Girl named Sam one Boy named Sam one Girl named Maria with all my cattle excepting three Steers all my Horses excepting two all my House Hold and Kitchen Furniture all the money I have arising from my Sister Elizabeth Suttington's Estate excepting Sixty Dollars which is to come out of the Surplus of that Estate after the Legacies are paid which sum will devise hereafter.

7th I Will and bequeath to my Wife Elizabeth McDannald the money coming from Hugh Wickline Estate to me.

8th I Will and bequeath to my Son Hugh McDannald two Locations Number of Acres not recollect one of them lying on the West side of the plantation I now live on the other on the East.

9th I Will and bequeath to my Son Hugh McDannald three Steers of the largest kind

10th I Will and bequeath to my Son Hugh McDannald two Horses namely his Riding Horse and a Brown Horse called Ranger.

11th I Will and bequeath to my Son Hugh McDannald one half of my Waggon.

12th I Will and bequeath to my Son Hugh McDannald my Stock of Hogs, Sheep, Farming utensile, all my crop of Corn and Garage

13th I Will and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Peage and her Heirs of her Body Four Slaves namely Hannah, Harriet, Maria and others.

14th I Will and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Peage Sixty Dollars to be paid by my Executors out of the Surplus money arising from the Estate of Elizabeth Suttington and her heirs.

15th I now call and appoint my Son John McDannald Executor of this my last Will and Testament disannulling all others heretofore made by me and declare this alone to be my last Will and Testament.

16th It is my Will should any difficulty arise as to the intentions or explanation of any of the devices made by me that the Party or Parties as the case may be from this interested Characters bound for a upright wife and they choose a trial and decision to be final to all intents and purposes in this behalf I have however set my hand & Seal this 15th day of Oct 1825 his

In the name of God amen I William Gatewood of the
 County of Bath and Commonwealth of Virginia being com-
 pressed with the uncertainty of life and feeling that my continu-
 uance in this world is drawing to a close and for the purpose
 of settling all my worldly concerns do make this my last will
 and Testament in manner and form following It is my
 Will and I do hereby direct that all my just debts and
 funeral expenses be paid as soon as practicable after my
 decease and to enable my executors hereafter named to execute
 this part of my Will It is my desire that they immediately after
 my decease sell as much of my personal estate at their discre-
 tion as will answer the purpose all the property I have heretofore
 given to my two Son Kamps and Travis living in the county
 of Essex I do hereby confirm unto them including a negro
 man James which I loaned unto my said son Travis and to
 his heirs forever I will and bequeath unto my son Warwick
 my negro woman Lucy and her three children Lewis, Sulip
 and Garrison the name of the third one not now recollect
 and future increase to him and his heirs forever also I will
 unto my said son Warwick and to his heirs forever my negro
 men Isaac Pittman, Jordan and John all the stock and other
 property I have heretofore given to him I do now confirm unto him
 I Will and bequeath unto my son Samuel Vance Gatewood and
 to his heirs forever one tract of Land said to contain one hundred
 Acres lying on Little Back Creek which I purchased of Joseph
 Smith also the following negroes to wit C Armstead, C Aford,
 little James, Chloa, Matilda & Judy and the increase of the
 females of them whom ever shall marry or arrive to the age
 of twenty one years) The tract of Land upon which I reside
 being conveyed to me and my wife Jane who at my decease
 will have a fee simple right to the same it is my Will and
 I do hereby earnestly request my wife to will the same at her
 decease to my said son Samuel but should she not think proper
 to do so I hereby will and bequeath unto him and to his heirs

one fifth part of all the negroes with their future increase which
 I intend to will to my wife Jane during her natural life with
 the exception of Lucinda I also in my son Samuel my watch and
 my Gun I will and bequeath unto my daughter Frances
 who lately intermarried with William Pittow and to
 her heirs forever the following slaves to wit Julius, Laura,
 George, Poldard, Ben, Spencer, Leonard, Eliza, Matilda,
 and James together with the Stock and furniture
 which I have already given her and which she has in possession
 I Will and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Jane and to
 her heirs forever the following Slaves to wit Harry, Robinson the
 elder, Nelson, Anderson, Peter Charles, Lewis, Rosetta, Fanny,
 and Sally with the future increase of the females of them
 I Will and bequeath unto my dear Wife Jane during her nat-
 ural life my Slaves Tom, Billy, Daniel, Kandell, Simon
 Thornton, Ferry, Willis, Nancy, Peggy, Lucinda,
 and Judy until her decease it is my will that said Slaves with
 the exception of Judy and Lucinda with their future increase
 be divided between my said son Samuel and Daughter
 Frances and Mary Jane in the following manner
 one fifth part as before mentioned is to go to Samuel
 and the other four fifths to be equally divided between my
 said Daughters and to their heirs forever but should my wife
 comply with my request and at her death will to my son
 Samuel the land before mentioned then it is my will that all
 my Slaves with the exception of fore said shall go to my
 said Daughters all of my Stock of every kind with my
 House hold and Kitchen Furniture together with my
 Farming utensials I Will and bequeath unto my
 Wife Jane to dispose of as she may think proper
 with this request that she give to my son Samuel and
 my daughter Mary Jane whenever they may marry
 or come of age as much as will in her opinion be
 equal in value to what I have given to my son
 Warwick and daughter Frances

It is my Will that at the decease of my wife my negro
 girl Lucinda shall be permitted to choose which of my
 children she will live with and that such one as
 she may choose shall have the said girl Lucinda
 It is my will that my old negro woman Peggy shall be
