In the name of god amen I Jacob Clerk of the County of Bath and State of Virginia Being Sick and weak in body but sound in mind considering the certainty Death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs and thereby be better prepared to leave this World when it shall please God to call me hence do hereby make this my last will and Testament in the manner and form following that is to say I do give and bequeath my soul to god that gave it and my Body to the Earth to be buried in the County of Bath State of Virginia in the place mentioned and after my Debts funeral Charges are paid I do give and bequeath as followeth First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Ruth with all my moveables at Bonds and Cash after the payment of Debts and the Legacies here after mentioned I do bequeath to my wife my part of the salt pater Cows I also give and bequeath to my son Micah, John and Matthias two Dollars Each and I give and bequeath to my Daughters Rebecca McLaughlin Peggy Pitt and Eve further two Dollars Each I also give and bequeath to my first Grandson that is to say John, Jacob, William, Henry, Isaac Westman and William Westman my son in law one Dollar Each I also give and bequeath to my son Peter and George four hundred acres of Land lying in the County of Hanover is to equally divided between them My son George to pay twenty three Dollars the Half of the

Castle of recovering said land and lastly I do here by constitute and appoint my son Peter Clark to be my sole Executor of this my last will and testament revoking and annulling all all former Wills by me heretofore made. Ratifying and confirming this and none other to be my last Will and Testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand affixed my seal this 13th day of December in the Year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and twelve

Alexander McBean, & John Perry ^{William McBean & John Perry} jointly and jointly bound unto James Barbour Esquire Governor of Virginia in the sum of thirty thousand dollars for the use of the Commonwealth to the which payment well and truly to be made to the said Governor or his assigns we bind ourselves our heirs & assigns and a firm obligation fully and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 13th day of July 1813 The condition of the above Obligation is such that whereas the above William McBean is constituted and appointed Sheriff of Bath County by commission from James Barbour Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia bearing date the 19th day of June One Thousand eight hundred and thirteen and 31st Year of the Commonwealth. If therefore the said William McBean shall truly and faithfully collect account for and pay the amount of the public taxes imposed by law within in the said County of Bath for the Year 1813 as

in full force

The condition of the above Obligation is such that whereas the
above named William Mc Donal is constituted and appointed
Sheriff of the county of Bath by commission from the Gov-
ernor under the seal of the Commonwealth dated the 19th day
of June last past If therefore the said William Mc Donal
shall not and truly collect all taxes and account for and
pay the same in such manner as by law directed and also all
fines forfeitures and amercements accruing or becoming due to
the Commonwealth in the said County and shall duly account for
and pay the same to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth for the
time being for the use of the Commonwealth in like manner
as is or shall be directed in the case of public taxes and in all
things shall truly and faithfully execute the said office of Sheriff
during the time of his continuance therein then the above Obliga-
tion to be void else to remain in full force and virtue
