In the name of god am I Jacob Clerk of the County of Bath and State of Virginia Being Sick and weak in body but sound in mind considering the certainty Death and the uncertainty of the time thereof and being Desirous to settle my world by affairs and thereby to better prepare to leave this World when it shall please God to call me hereof do therefore make this my last will and Testament in the manner and form following that is to say First and sensible I bequeath my soul to god that gave it and my Body to the Earth to be buried in the same as it was born in to be at the Benefit mentioned and after my Debts funeral Charges are paid I desire and bequeath as followeth - First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Bushwick all my moveables at Bonds and Cash after the paying out of Debts and the Legacies here after mentioned I also bequeath to my wife my part of the said pell Cow I also give and bequeath to my son Micah, John and Matthias two Dollars Each and I give and bequeath to my Daughters Rebecca McLaughlin Peggy pots and Eva Fuller two Dollars Each I also give and bequeath to my few Grandsons that is to say John, Jacob, William, Henry, Isaac Hartman and William Hartman my son in four one Dollar Each I also give and bequeath to my sons Peter and George four Hundred Dollars of Land lying in the County of Hanover equally divided between them My son George to pay twenty three Dollars the half of the

Costs of recording said bond and lastly I do hereby constitute  
and appoint my said Notary Clerk to be my sole Executor of this my  
last will and testament working and amending all former  
Wills by me heretofore made. Ratifying and confirming the same  
and none other to be my last Will and Testament for testifying

bearing date the 19th day of June One Thousand eight hundred  
and thirteen and 37th Year of the Commonwealth. Wherefore

lect account for and pay the amount of the public taxes imposed  
by law within in the said County of Bath for the Year 1813 as

Sheriff of the County of Bath by commission from the Gov-  
ernor under the seal of the Commonwealth dated the 19th day  
of June last past. Wherefore the said Wm. W.C. Deane  
shall truly and faithfully collect all taxes and account for and  
pay the same in such manner as by law directed and also all  
fines forfeitures and amercements occurring or becoming due to  
the Commonwealth in the said County and shall duly account for  
and pay the same to the Treasurer of the Commonwealth for the  
time being for the use of the Commonwealth in like manner  
as is or shall be directed in the case of public taxes and in all  
things shall truly and faithfully execute the said office of Sheriff
