desolation and then to take me to himselfe into that peace and
rest and incomparabile felicity which he haue prepared for those
that love and fear his holy name amen Blessed be god in prises
I give my Body to the earth from whence it was taken in full assurance of
its Resurrection from thence at the last day as for my burial I desire it
may be done without pomp or state ... in at the discretion of my
Executors hereafter Nomine who I shalbe not well manage it with all
Regard Prescence as to my earthly Estate will and Testimony doo
that all my Debts be Paid Item I give to my loving Sister Elizabeth
and my Brother in law William Theta my Plantation lying in
Augusta County and joining John Cushing same and a tract of land
of Landes nowadays my other Plantation on High Creek in Bath County
I give to be Equally divided Between my Brother Alexander Clark and my
Brother Samuel Clark and my Sister Mary and Lincoln and James Kilby
Bond I give to be Equally divided Between william and John Theta
and I freely forgive John Lockridge what he Owe me now or heretofore
I give John Theta what he owes me now I give my Bond with
John william Theta junior and my New Jackel I give to my
Brother Alexander Clark and I forgive william Theta the Rec
mainer of the Bonds that I have on him for a man over
all and the remainder of my Estate after payment of my
Debt to be Equally divided Between william Theta also Clark
John Sonckap Lincoln Lincoln and my Bed and Bed
Clothes I give to my Brother Willm Doughter Elizabeth and
to constitute william and John Theta Executors of this my
last will and Testament in witness wherof I have
